WEBINAR 1 April 13th: Hospice, Palliative Care and Home Care, Oh My!

All are important when choosing an end of life provider; but it can be difficult for families to understand the role each provider plays. Healthcare providers even have difficulty describing and clarifying the varying levels of care and service. In this course, attendees will earn 1 CE credit and learn to:

- · Clearly define the roles and funding options of hospice, palliative and home care
- Understand the new CMS changes to palliative and home care
- Understand and address key issues in the hospice/home care relationship
- · Provide education to their patients and their families about end-of-life care options

WEBINAR 2 May 4h: "How Do People Afford a Caregiver?"

As a healthcare provider how often are you asked this question? This course is designed for case managers, social workers, and other professionals whose job requires you to educate patients discharging home. In this course you will 1 CE credit and learn how to identify and acquire resources for in-home care that is not paid for by Medicare. Learn how to confidently navigate important homecare funding sources when you ask these four questions:

- Do you have long term care insurance?
- Were you or a spouse a veteran who served during a time of war?
- Do you have a life insurance policy?
- Do you own your home?

WEBINAR 3 June 8th: "Patient Driven Grouping Models: Understanding the Changing Landscape of Care Delivery"

The shift of the Home Health payment structure from Fee-For-Service to Value-Based Care continues to evolve since the implementation of the Affordable Care Act. Hospitals and SNFs have seen shorter lengths of stay than in prior years. And COVID-19 has impacted those stays by driving more Seniors to opt for rehab in their home. This shift has made it even more important to understand the adopt the PDGM Model. As Medicare tightens reimbursement more Medicare patients will be left with less coverage and shorter lengths of stay. In this course you will earn 1 CE credit and learn and understand:

- The PDGM (Patient Driven Groupings Model) that CMS announced.
- The ramifications of PDGM for those tasked with discharging patients from Hospitals, SNFs, and Home Health Agencies.
- What resources and tools are available for your patients who may fall into a service gap.
